Mobile design and accessibility use similar technical rules.

Use responsive design with CSS (media queries). This helps pages fit small screens. It also keeps content readable.

Add alt text to images with the alt attribute. Screen readers read it, and it shows if images do not load.

Use relative units like %, em, or rem. This lets text resize on different devices.

Make buttons large and use simple navigation. This supports touch screens and users with motor problems.

Optimize performance (small images, less code). Pages load faster on mobile and assistive tools.
